

Whatever the real or imagined merits of capital punishment, there is neither a mandate nor a justification for inhumane confinement prior to imposition of sentence. Yet warehousing for death, sometimes leavened with brutality, is the universal fate of condemned prisoners in the United States, a group that comprises almost 3,000 individuals today. The enormous suffering caused by this human warehousing is the subject of this book.
